

# **Knowing Your Trailer Weights**

Use the below chart to record your towing and trailer weights



### YOUR MAXIMUM TOWING WEIGHTS

Your vehicle and towbar will each have a maximum towing rating and ball weight, record the smallest weight of the two.

Most trailers, camper trailers and caravans over 750kg have a compliance plate attached to the trailer chassis or in the front boot, this will provide you with the maximum gross trailer mass and aggregate trailer mass.
